"Blogger" by Google

Devices: Android and iPhone

Features: Access to Google's blog, known as Blogger or Blogspot, from your phone.



Pros: You can quickly add ideas or pictures when inspiration hits on the go, plus save without publishing so you can polish up your posts when you get home.

Cons: If you switch to HTML mode to do fine tuning from your home computer, even after switching back to front access mode (where you just type normal sentences), the phone app will always open as HTML mode and not let you change that post to normal editing access.

Overall: Useful for bloggers, but the HTML glitch is serious problem that needs to be addressed before this app is fully functional.

Recommend at 2.5 out of 4 stars.

Adult Volunteer Opportunities

Would you be willing to assist the library in sorting and shelving its incoming materials delivery? We are looking for someone with basic computer skills, good organizational skills, and an interest in helping us serve the public in a vital way. The process takes about 3-4 hours start to finish, from the point when our delivery arrives on Fridays (usually between 11:30 and 12:30), and involves the following: emptying bins of library materials (usually between 10 and 20 bins) onto carts, processing materials which have been reserved by Sudbury library patrons, and filing all of these alphabetically on our reserve shelves. There is some standing, sitting, and moving of loaded, wheeled carts involved. Staff will train, and are available throughout the process to answer questions.

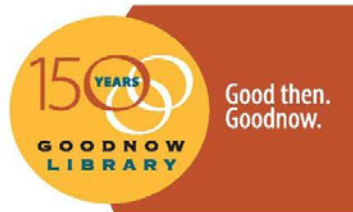

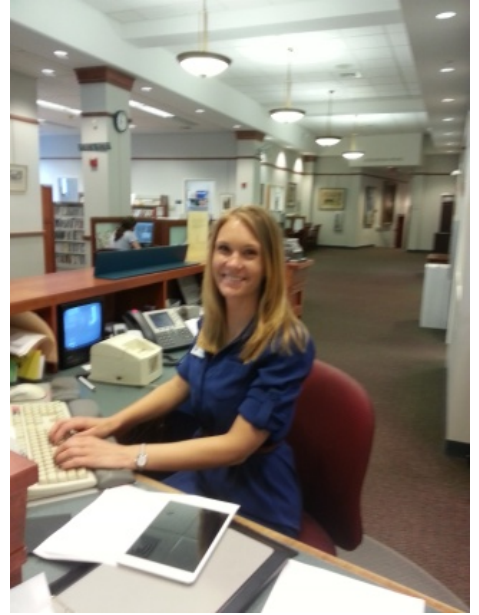

Join Miss Victoria on Friday mornings for a themed storytime fun and craft! This program is perfect for children ages 2 ½ and up with their caregivers.

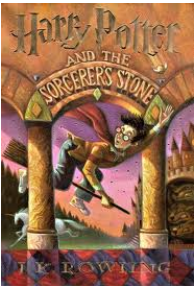

Lego Club for Older Kids, Thursday, August 1, 7:00-8:00 PM, Story & Craft Room



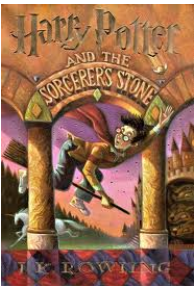

Summer Book Group: *Harry Potter & the Sorcerer's Stone*, Wednesday, August 7, 7:00-7:45 PM, Large Meeting Room



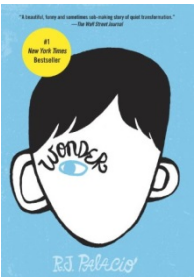
