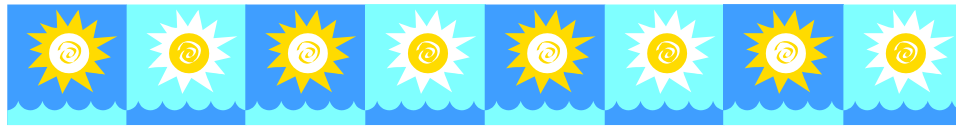
Adult Book Groups

At the age of six, Doris Kearns of Rockville Centre in Long Island, New York began to keep a detailed score book of Brooklyn Dodger baseball games. This allowed her to describe each game to her bank-examiner father when he came home from work. We'll follow these early years of nostalgia and coming-of-age that would lead the author to a 'grand slam' career of writing books on history. The Bookies bet this book will touch all the bases of a good discussion! Hope you can head from home to the library and pick up a single copy at the Circulation Desk.

Last month, our discussion of ***The Art Forger*** by B. A. Shapiro was a unanimous vote of confidence for this mystery that makes all readers complicit in the fine art of forgery!

Next up, we will make a group arrangement based on *Gifts from the Sea* by Anne Morrow Lindbergh on Friday, July 11th.

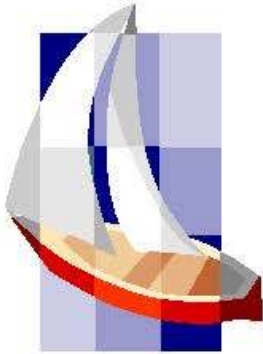
Please bring a silk or fresh flower and we will create the arrangement together!

Wee Reads • Wednesdays, 9:30-10:00 AM, and 11:00-11:30 AM • Story & Craft Room

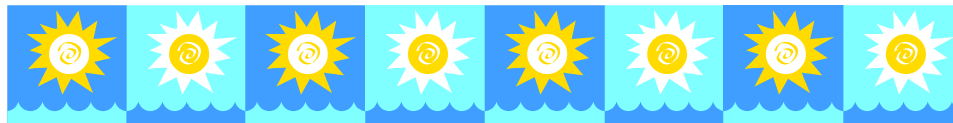

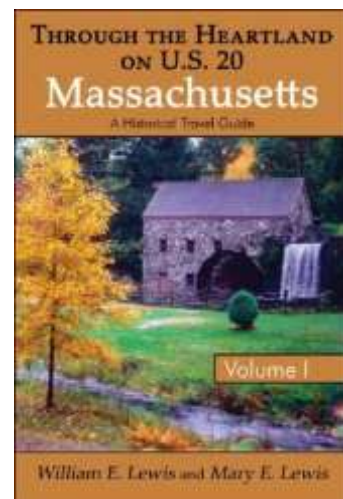

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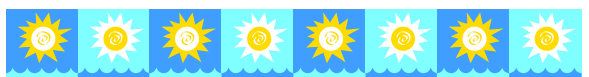
