Thanks to the Goodnow Library Foundation and the efforts of staff, we now offer coffee at the library. The newlyminted coffee cart is located on the second floor across from our popular study rooms. During the installation

on Thursday morning, one patron declared, "This library is officially the best library in the world!" We hope you will agree and come see for yourself. We have started with a sampling of regular, flavored, decaf and teas. If you have a favorite, please leave us a note in the suggestion box so we can keep in stock for you

This is a pilot project sponsored by the Goodnow Library Foundation and came about as a result of the focus groups it has held for various groups during the past year. The idea of having coffee in the library came up repeatedly, so, in cooperation with library staff, the Foundation decided to give it a try. The cart, Keurig machine and other accessories were paid for with a donation from the

Foundation, but ongoing coffee costs will be covered by a \$1 charge per "pod." This will be an honor system, so one measure of success, besides use, will be people's willingness to pay for their caffeine fix.

As always, we welcome your thoughts and feedback as we try new things.




Itsy Bitsy Yoga • Tuesday, May 27, 11:30-12:15 AND 12:15-1:00 PM • Community Room

Bill and Mary Lewis Through the Heartland on U.S. 20


