
"The Bookies" Book Discussion Group

November in the McQueen Gallery: Purely Pastel 2013

Showing for the month of November at Sudbury's Goodnow Library is a group show of work done by students of Jeanne Rosier Smith, PSA, who has taught pastels in her Sudbury studio for the past six years. Their work is wide-ranging and accomplished, a fact which Smith attributes in part to the monthly change in topic and in part to the variety of students. Smith explains that she especially enjoys teaching art to adults, who often relish the time they get to devote to a passion they may have had to put off for other demands. "One thing that makes the classes so interesting is the great range of experience people bring in; we have lawyers, educators, nurses, art teachers, graphic designers, high school students, a policeman, engineers of all kinds. Everyone has artistic ability (latent or not) which can be brought out with the right encouragement and training." Many exhibiting artists have begun showing, and garnering awards, in regional and national competitions. "I am so proud of this show: the work speaks for itself, and shows what a talented and dedicated group of artists I get to work with," says Smith.

Pastels are sticks of pure pigments held together with a minimum of binders, giving them their rich, velvety texture. The pastellist learns to control color, value, edge, line and texture with the pressure and touch of a stroke. Edgar Degas, Mary Cassat and James Abbott McNeill Whistler all popularized and elevated the use of pastel for a modern audience, and some of the nation's most accomplished artists continue working in the medium today.

Jeanne Rosier Smith is a signature member of the Pastel Society of America, and an artist member of the Copley Society and the Salmagundi Club. After earning a PhD and teaching college English for ten years, she became a full time artist in 2004. She is represented by four Massachusetts galleries: Powers in Acton, Gallery 31 in Orleans, Francesca Anderson in Lexington and Sosebee on Nantucket. In the past year her work has appeared in *International Artist, American Art Collector*, and *The Pastel Journal*. In addition to teaching weekly classes in Sudbury, she teaches workshops around the country and abroad--Provence next June and Croatia in September 2015.


