

In September, we will read and discuss any biography of George and/or Ira Gershwin.





"<u>Facebook</u>" by Facebook

Devices: Android and iPhone



Features: Allows you to check and post to your Facebook account on the go from your phone.

Pros: Status updates, posting photos, location check-in, chat, and friend requests.

Cons: Frequently stops connecting, or partially stops connecting. Both Android and iPhone users report not receiving updated statuses, not being able to upload photos. Other connectivity issues include the app frequently not functioning when the cell phone is connected over Wi-Fi, and having to turn off Wi-Fi___33 and use only cell phone towers with the app.

Overall: Works, barely.

Recommend at 1 out of 4 stars.

Adult Volunteer Opportunities

Would you be willing to assist the library in sorting and shelving its incoming materials delivery? We are looking for someone with basic computer skills, good organizational skills, and an interest in helping us serve the public in a vital way. The process takes about 3-4 hours start to finish, from the point when our delivery arrives on Fridays (usually between 11:30 and 12:30), and involves the following: emptying bins of



library materials (usually between 10 and 20 bins) onto carts, processing materials which have been reserved by Sudbury library patrons, and filing all of these alphabetically on our reserve shelves. There is some standing, sitting, and moving of loaded, wheeled carts involved. Staff will train, and are available throughout the process to answer questions.


Sudbury Family Network Magic Show with Fran Flynn Thursday, September 26, 4:00PM-5:00PM, Community Room
