



MOBILE APP REVIEWS FOR YOU

"Handsent SMS" by Jacklin & Alenyu

Devices: Android and iPhone

Features: Replaces standard text messaging app.



Pros: Better grouping of text messages, more options if you go into advanced, and allows you to assign different mp3 as text alerts (in fact, you can use it to assign mp3s as ringtones that are otherwise not accessible from your default ringtone assigner), and assign pictures to contacts.

Cons: Sometimes the assigned ringtone will (seemingly randomly) switch back to default. Also, you have to know how to disable your default texting app, or they will both alert you and waste memory saving duplicate messages.

Overall: A vast improvement over the default texting app.

Recommended at 3.5 out of 4 stars.

Volunteer Opportunities

Would you be willing to assist the library in sorting and shelving its incoming materials delivery? We are looking for someone with basic computer skills, good organizational skills, and an interest in helping us serve the public in a vital way. The process takes about 3-4 hours start to finish, from the point when our delivery arrives on Fridays (usually between 11:30 and 12:30), and involves the following: emptying bins of library materials (usually between 10 and 20 bins) onto carts,

processing materials which have been reserved by Sudbury library patrons, and filing all of these alphabetically on our reserve shelves. There is some standing, sitting, and moving of loaded, wheeled carts involved. Staff will train, and are available throughout the process to answer questions



On Display in the Goodnow Library Children's Room May 1-June 1, 2013


Reception May 30, 5:00 - 7:00 p.m.




