Online Resource of the Month: Freegal

<u>Freegal Music</u> gives you access to hundreds of thousands of songs in the Sony Music catalog, with your Goodnow Library card!

How Freegal Music Works:

- Library users have a weekly download limit of 3 songs. You will be able to keep track of your downloads in the upper right corner of the site. Every song has a sample clip you can listen to before you download.
- The downloads on this site are all in the MP3 format with no DRM. This service will work with any MP3 player, including iPod, and can be loaded into iTunes. It works on both PCs and Macs.
- Be sure to check out the browsing areas, especially *Artists A to Z* and the genre lists . Click on *see all genres* to view dozens of categories.

December 2011 Exhibit in the McQueen Gallery

"Mixed Messages," mixed media works by Jim Eng, Kim Nielssen and Randy LeSage in the McQueen Exhibit Area and Meeting Room. This group exhibit reveals mixed media works that sometimes intersect but just as often, stretch in varied directions.

Jim Eng offers his unique vision through combining collage, transfer, assemblage as well as painting and drawing. His works reveal a heightened expression through low relief assemblage of found and distressed objects with subtle interplays of collage, drawing and painting. At once stately in composition and free in association, viewers may delight in their own interpretations of these nuanced works. Imagery is culled from everyday sources to arcane photo images and written passages, sometimes worked with drawing and painted elements. Great stuff for the eye and mind to dwell on.

Kim Nielson is attracted to collage because as a medium it is capable of evoking the feeling of both past and the present. By overlapping and juxtaposing various papers he is able to arouse that feeling of the past as it mingles with the present. Kim is fond of quoting a portion of a poem by T.S. Eliot.

Time present and time past Are both perhaps present in time future And time future contained in time past.

Randy LeSage uses mixed media including drawing, painting, found materials and some printmaking methods to convey his vision. At times, these works convey impressions of cultural comment from the tragic to the comic. While other works may simply celebrate the unique juxtaposition of associations drawn from imagery and handling of materials.

Jim Eng is a retired professor of studio art at Framingham State College. Kim Nielson is a professional framer of art in the Boston area. Randy LeSage teaches studio art at the Worcester Art Museum and works at the Goodnow Library.
