A Note from the Director

Spring greetings to all from the Library! We have been busy bees here, planning new programs, purchasing new material and even doing some Spring cleaning. The Friends are busy setting up their annual book and bake sale (April 5-6-7), while the Foundation investigates ways to support technological and community development.

My focus has been on getting ready for the big kick off events of April 27 and 28! We will have something for **everyone!** We will have hay rides on Saturday morning, where Pat and Pam, two strawberry roan Belgian draft horses will pull a wagon all around the parking lot. Salem Five Bank will be giving out special 150th balloons to every child. Music will play a big part of the day as well. We will start off with bluegrass entertainment by the Clyde County Express, followed throughout the day by performances by local students and residents of piano, flute and guitar. The Musicgals, Acafella and Accent will also perform.

In the Story Craft room in the Children's department, we will have an all-inclusive "Off the Wall" mural project. Everyone will have a chance to take part in creating a piece of art that will hang in the library for years to come, and a miniature of the painting will be sealed in our 25 year time capsule!

There will be several library tours that will highlight the architecture, art and history of the library, featuring local experts Helen Marie Casey speaking about our Hosmer paintings, Kevin Latady, the architect who oversaw the Atkinson Wing renovation in 1999, and Hal Cutler, as John Goodnow, original benefactor of the Goodnow Library. Later in the afternoon, there will be cake, food and more music.

Sunday will feature an elegant tea party, with flowers, fine china and finger foods. Music will be provided by Raquel Smith, pianist. In addition, guests will be entertained by Libby Franck, a storyteller and actress who will portray Julia Ward Howe, the author of the "Battle Hymn of the Republic."

You won't want to miss the inauguration of a year of celebration!

Who is helping give out half a million free books across America on April 23rd?

We are!

On April 23, 2013, 25,000 volunteers from Berkeley to Boston and Sitka to Sarasota will give away half a million free books in more than 6,000 towns and cities across the country.

World Book Night U.S. is an ambitious campaign to give thousands of free, specially printed paperbacks to light or nonreaders across America on one day. Volunteer book lovers help promote reading by going out into their communities and sharing free copies of books they love. The mission of World Book Night is to seek out those without the means or access to printed books.

Some of the volunteers in our community will be picking up their books at Goodnow Library and sharing them in locations as diverse as VA hospitals, roller skating rinks, mass transit, nursing homes, schools, food pantries, and more. We at Goodnow Library are proud to be a partner in World Book Night U.S. for a second year.

We will be holding a pre-World Book Night reception the week before April 23. During the week of April 15, we are welcoming our local givers in to pick up their books and celebrate.

Bestselling authors Ann Patchett and James Patterson are this year's honorary chair-people. James Patterson said: "In my experience, when people like what they are doing, they do more of it. This is the genius of World Book Night — it gets people reading by connecting them with amazing, enjoyable books. I'm honored to be a part of it."

"I'm very proud to be a part of World Book Night," Ann Patchett added. "As both a writer and a bookseller, I'm all in favor of getting books into the hands of people who might not otherwise have access to them."

The books were chosen by an independent panel of booksellers and librarians through several rounds of voting. The printing of the free books was possible due to generosity of the authors, publishers, and book manufacturing companies.

Although it is too late to be a giver this year, those interested in participating in the future can sign up for the WBN mailing list for news and updates on World Book Night 2014. The free WBN editions are not available at the Goodnow Library at any time, except for the WBN volunteers to take into the community, but we will be displaying the books in their regular editions all spring. 

This month the library will showcase "Old Glory", a community-based assemblage created by students of Sudbury artist, Cathleen E. Bradley.


Made from recycled plastic materials painted in red, white, blue and bits of other colors, this dynamic image of the American flag will certainly catch your eye.

Volunteer Opportunities

Would you be willing to assist the library in sorting and shelving its incoming materials delivery? We are looking for someone with basic computer skills, good organizational skills, and an interest in helping us serve the public in a vital way. The process takes about 3-4 hours start to finish, from the point when our delivery arrives on Fridays (usually between 11:30 and 12:30), and involves the following: emptying bins of library materials (usually between 10 and 20 bins) onto carts, processing materials which have been reserved by Sudbury library patrons, and filing all of these alphabetically on our reserve shelves. There is some standing, sitting, and moving of loaded, wheeled carts involved. Staff will train, and are available throughout the process to answer questions

IS provides online interaction with the proprietary Folio Census Database of Physicians and Healthcare Facilities for the individual New England states (Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and Connecticut), New York, New Jersey, Ohio, and Pennsylvania. With 200,000 physicians and 35,000 healthcare facilities, you can be confident that the physician or facility important to you will be located with all the relevant contact and identifier information.

MOBILE APP REVIEWS FOR YOU

"Google Voice" by Google.

Devices: Android, iPhone, Blackberry.

Features: Accesses Google voice features through your phone.

Pros: Can use wifi to connect. Allows viewing of voice messages translated into text. If you send your text messages from the app, the number that appears will be your Google voice number, not the physical phone number, eliminating confusion from friends who hit "save" on your physical phone number.



Cons: It has grouping issues. If a friend sends a new message to you instead of hitting "reply" to a message you sent, it starts a new conversation chain. Additionally, images can't be sent, so you'll have to use a different text app to send SMS images. It doesn't alert, so you have to remember to check it. Your default phone text program will still receive the same texts, unless you turn it off, and if you accidentally hit reply, it will be lost from the Google voice text conversation chain.

Overall: A great idea, with room for a lot of improvement.

Recommended at 2 out of 4 stars.
