Once upon the time in a faraway kingdom lived a knight named George. George was a good and brave knight. He led the king's army to protect the kingdom and all of its people.




Outside the kingdom, in a dark cave, lived a mighty dragon! This dragon could fly through the sky faster than any bird! He could

Week 2: St. George & the Dragon Build It: Once Upon a Slime -Make Magical Oobleck!

Step 1: Place 4 tablespoons of cornstarch into bowl. The enclosed bag contains approximately 4 tablespoons.

Step 2: Start by adding 2 tablespoons water, mixing with your hands. Add more water, a few drops at a time, to get the proper consistency.

- DOES YOUR MIXTURE TEAR AS YOU DRAG YOUR FINGER ACROSS IT, BUT THEN REFORM QUICKLY? IF SO, IT'S READY!
- IF IT'S TOO SOLID, ADD A LITTLE MORE WATER UNTIL IT'S THE RIGHT CONSISTENCY!
- IT SHOULD FEEL SOLID WHEN YOU SQUEEZE IT, AND DRIP THROUGH YOUR FINGERS WHEN YOU STOP!
- FOR EXTRA OPTIONAL FUN, ADD DROPS OF TEMPERA PAINT OR ADD SOME ROCKS OR PLASTIC TOYS! DO THEY SIT ON TOP OR DO THEY SINK?



Step 3: Have fun with your oobleck! Squeeze it, pour it, play in it!

NOTE: PLEASE DISPOSE OF OOBLECK PROPERLY WHEN YOU ARE DONE PLAYING! SIMPLY ALLOW MIXTURE TO DRY OUT OVERNIGHT AND DISPOSE OF CORNSTARCH IN THE TRASH.





Week 2: St. George & the Dragon Craft It: Make a Dragon Puppet!

- Step 1: Color in the dragon face using lots of bright colors!!
- Step 2: Glue the dragon face onto the paper plate
