- The library has a beautiful new piece of artwork on display on the main staircase leading to the second floor. The collage was created during Good Neighbor Day, held in September. This project was spearheaded by Sudbury residents Bethany Shaw and Anna Ryan and funded by the Sudbury Cultural Council. Many residents and library visitors contributed to the creation of this meaningful artwork, which reflects the strong sense of community connection in Sudbury.
- The library is pleased to welcome Kristin Wilcox, one of the town's social workers, who is now offering drop-in services once a week for anyone seeking mental health support or assistance navigating community resources.
- After some initial technical issues, the Smart Lockers are now fully operational. These lockers allow patrons to pick up their holds at any time, day or night, and are conveniently located at the library entrance.
- The library has developed monthly walking tours in partnership with several community organizations to explore the town's natural landscape, historic sites, and Indigenous heritage. Previous walks have included visits to Barton Farm and the Wadsworth Monument. The walks take place on the fourth Wednesday of each month from 1:00–2:00 PM.
